- 1. Use of the Treaty for export and movement of defense articles/services/information does not in any way waive any of the requirements in each agreement, including those regarding disclosure and use, intellectual property, and Third Party Sales and transfers.**
- 2. Eligible programs are identified on this list; it is up to the exporter to determine whether export or movement of an article linked to one of these programs is consistent with Treaty requirements.**
- 3. Sensitive or Classified programs which MAY be eligible are not listed here – please consult with appropriate defense authority in the U.S. or Australia.**
- 4. Master, Umbrella and Framework Agreements permit the establishment of bilateral projects or data/info exchanges – but do not in themselves constitute bilateral projects.**
- 5. For Multilateral (ML) Master, Umbrella or Framework Agreements indicated below – ONLY bilateral program/project data or bilateral programs/projects can be considered for Treaty eligibility.**
